


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

189 LITTLE COULEE TRAIL: Located just outside of Three Forks, Montana in Gallatin County.

THREE FORKS: Three Forks, Montana, is easily accessible off I-90 (exit 278), US-287, and Montana Highway 2, and lies en route between Yellowstone National Park and Glacier National Park. The area at the headwaters of the Missouri River and surrounding the town of Three Forks has some of the most colorful legends and early-day history of any place in Montana.

BOZEMAN: Located in a sweeping valley in the heart of the Rocky Mountains, Gallatin County is the most populated and fastest growing county in scenic southwest Montana.
